Project reporting

HUD does not allow victim service providers to use HMIS. Instead, HUD requires that victim service providers must use a database comparable to HMIS to produce Annual Progress Reports required for grantees with HUD CoC Program funding.

What database is used by the Victim Service Provider grantee or subgrantee for HUD CoC Program reporting?	
Where can the specifications for this database be reviewed?	
Who has reviewed the database regarding its ability to produce reports that meet specifications for the APR? (Name, title)
